DWC TERTIARY SCHOLARSHIPS OPEN

The four annual scholarships are valued up to \$32,500 per student over the three to four years of their tertiary study.

The scholarships also offer summer work and guaranteed employment on the West Coast on completion of the applicant's tertiary study.

"The scholarships are designed to grow and retain highly qualified residents on the West Coast by removing barriers to training and employment," explains DWC chief executive Heath Milne.

Rachel Morris, from Hokitika, was one of DWC's 2022 scholarship recipients. She is currently pursuing her nursing studies at the Ara Institute of Canterbury. During her academic break, Rachel had the opportunity to work as a healthcare assistant at Te Nikau Hospital in Greymouth.
